CHRISTMAS IN THE HOMES YOU SUPPORT



Children in Mexico celebrate the Christmas season from about mid December to mid January. During that time, the children in our Homes have an opportunity to visit near or distant relatives living in their past communities. Some children have family members such as uncles or aunts take them for the holidays, or visit them in the Home.

Each Home we sponsor is associated with a Christian Church, so when children visit their past communities with a different spiritual culture, they usually can't wait till they return to the church they have become attached to. While visiting, they become little witnesses of what Christ is doing in their lives.

Some of the Youth are helped with bus fares to travel to their families scattered in all parts of Mexico. They also demonstrate positive changes in their lives and encourage other Youth to follow in their steps.

During the Christmas and New Year seasons, many Mexican churches or organizations come to visit the Homes. They play games, bring gifts and candy, and sometimes perform traditional plays for the children that remain at the Home. Sometimes Mexican church volunteers come and stay with the children, so the overworked House-parents can get some vacation time. They also help the remaining children with fun activities such as art projects, and singing and acting performances.

The seeds you have sown with your donations will grow far into the future!

A Team of 16 Volunteers from Pennsylvania and Indiana will spend one week with the children. They will brighten up the Home by painting, cleaning and repairing. These are tasks the House Parents do not have time to do in caring for the current 14 children 24 hours per day.

The Team will also enjoy the children by treating them to a Beach Fiesta, and a shopping spree to help the house parents with Christmas presents for the children. The Team and sponsoring churches raised funds for travel, room and board, and for materials plus operational expenses. Caring Action for Children nor-


mally supplies this Home US\$ 500 per month. An extra US\$3000 from the Team goes a long way to help the budget of the Home.
