They come to us from their homes high up in the mountains, where people speak only Mextecan. By studying with us in Tlaxiaco, they have the chance to further their education.

This is Sapphire, who was welcomed to our Home in Monterrey - The Shelter. She is three year old, and likes playing with toys.



Uriel is Sapphire's brother. He is 6 years old and in the 2nd primary grade. Uriel has some motor development delays, and has trouble walking well. He has been getting physical rehabilitation through the UANL (Autonomous University of Nuevo León.) Despite his challenges, Uriel loves his sister, he is smart, and very noble. Due to a legal situation, he and his sister cannot leave the grounds of the Home. Psychologists are there to help with their emotional formation.
